Advent Reflection from Loyola Press

In the encounter between Mary and Elizabeth in today's Gospel, we learn that other people can help us recognize God's presence & action in our lives. Mary traveled to see Elizabeth because Elizabeth's pregnancy was a sign that everything the angel told Mary would truly happen. Elizabeth recognized Mary as the mother of her Lord because her unborn child, John the Baptist, leapt at the sound of Mary's greeting. Elizabeth and Mary rejoiced together at the wonderful things God was doing in their lives. We too are blessed when we have people who help us recognize God's action in our lives. We pray that our family can be this for one another. As you gather as a family, work together on a word search or hidden-picture puzzle until everyone has found each of the words or pictures in the puzzle. Talk about how people found words or pictures more easily than others & how easy it was to see the word or picture once someone else pointed it out. Observe that sometimes we need the help of others to recognize God's presence and action in our lives. Read today's Gospel together. Ask: What did Elizabeth recognize about Mary? (That she was to be the mother of Jesus, the Lord.) How did Elizabeth know this? (Her baby leapt with joy at Mary's greeting.) Pray together that as we share our faith together as a family, we may help one another recognize God's presence and action in our lives. Pray the Hail Mary together.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Modes of communication and transportation have certainly changed since Mary's time. She couldn't drive, fly, text or call her relative Elizabeth when she received news of Elizabeth's pregnancy – a miracle in itself since she was older and considered barren. In the story, Mary, herself pregnant, made a long and dangerous journey to be present and to help her relative. How often do you reach out to share the gift of yourself and your support with others? We now have texting, twitter and so many other ways of communicating without talking, but they don't compare with hearing the live voice of a loved one over the phone or in person. There is a joy, peace & comfort that comes from that experience and something we often take for granted until it is too late. Whose voice would you like to hear? Who would love to hear your voice? The two mothers-to-be come together to praise God and his miraculous action in their lives. Elizabeth's unborn child, John the Baptist, also gives praise to God for when he hears Mary's voice, he leaps for joy because he recognizes his Lord, Jesus. How often do you give praise to God for all God has done in your life? Does the presence of Jesus in your life bring you joy – a joy you share with others? It's the perfect season to do so!
