Easter Reflection from Bishop Robert Barron

Friends, maybe you've seen informal evangelists at football or baseball games holding up a sign: "John 3:16." Did you ever wonder what that means? Well, we hear this verse from the Gospel of John: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." I think it's good that those people hold up that sign, because in many ways that is the whole Gospel, and even the whole Christian tradition, in miniature. Every cathedral, every church, every poem, every drama, the life of every saint—that's what they're all about. Christianity does not announce, primarily, our virtue; it doesn't sing our praises; it doesn't exult in human civilization. What it primarily does is announce that message: that even in our sin—you might say, especially in our sin—God loved us. And so what did he do? He broke open his own heart and he sent his own self into our humanity to heal us and offer us eternal life.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

One of the things a faithful steward & disciple needs is perseverance. We see it in the first reading as Paul and Barnabas criss cross and revisit cities where they have shared the Good News. Why? Because people have a tendency to experience let down after an exciting event and revert back to how things were before. Paul and Barnabas knew that and so they went back to encourage, affirm and uplift so that people would be moved to persevere in the faith. What about us? We come to Mass on Sunday and are fed by Word and Sacrament, are surrounded by fellow believers, join in prayer and leave uplifted. Then comes Monday and work and chores and suddenly our faith life begins to take a back seat to the other events of our daily lives. We need to persevere: to pray daily, to witness by our lives, to read Sacred Scripture, attend daily Mass, invite the fallen away. Let us strive to persevere in faith like Paul and Barnabas.

STEWARDSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Kenmore Community Meal - The partnership between I.C. & Park United Methodist has expanded to include a free community meal which will be served in Waldeisen Hall on the last Tuesday of the month from 5 - 6:30 pm. The first meal will be served on June 25th and is open to everyone so come enjoy a free meal and enjoy fellowship with neighbors.
