History of Popes

#129- Pope Agapetus II (*pronounced ah-gah-PEET-uss*) - Pope from May 10, 946 – death, November 8, 955. Agapetus II, the son of Roman nobles, was the fifth handpicked pope of Roman senator Alberic II. He wasn't granted temporal power, but was very active in the management of the Church, and is remembered as being a holy man worthy of the office. Pope Agapetus worked to restore discipline in churches and monasteries that had grown lax. He is known for handling church politics particularly well. He resolved a spat between France and Germany over who was rightful Archbishop of Rheims, helped two bishops in modern-day Austria/Hungary determine the boundaries of their respective dioceses, & ensured that Italian monasteries which had been unlawfully seized be returned to their rightful owners. Agapetus knew who would succeed him, because Alberic demanded that the Romans elect his son and successor, Octavian, to be pope after Agapetus died. What else was going on in the world at the time? St. Alban's School, a secondary school that's still in operation today, was founded in 948 in St. Albans, England by Wulsin, abbot of the monastery bearing the same name.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

In a recent reflection by Bishop Robert Barron, he addresses Jn 21:15-19 where Jesus asks Peter three times to affirm his faith by telling him to "feed my lambs" and "tend my sheep". Bishop Barron reminds us that Christianity isn't a set of ideas, convictions or principles, but rather a relationship with a person – Jesus. This test of Peter by Jesus is a test of love in action. The questions posed are: "Are we willing to do what Jesus did? Are we willing to go on mission on his behalf?" We have so many opportunities for mission here. As we celebrate the feast of the Holy Trinity today, let us reflect on the love that is the inner life of the Triune God. How can we better reflect that love in our lives? Do we manifest that love with those around us – friend & stranger? Be a part of mission at IC and express the love of God to others through the Kenmore Free Store, St. Vincent de Paul, the Kenmore Community Meal, Peter Maurin and In His Name collections and the Step Up initiative. We don't need to go to foreign countries to go on mission in the name of Jesus!

STEWARDSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Kenmore Community Meal - The partnership between I.C. & Park United Methodist has expanded to include a free community meal which will be served in Waldeisen Hall on the last Tuesday of the month from 5 – 6:30 pm. The first meal will be served on June 25th and is open to everyone, so come enjoy a free meal and enjoy fellowship with neighbors. **Ways to help:** help in the kitchen (all food will be prepared onsite), be a greeter or a server and help keep costs down by placing requested items in the basket at the front entrance of the church. Requested items: jars of spaghetti sauce, pasta (not spaghetti), Italian or ranch salad dressing, canned chicken, cream of chicken soup, chicken & beef broth or stock, boxes of jello or pudding, cake mixes, canned fruit and veggies, boxes of rice, coffee, powdered creamer, sugar, koolaid and lemonade mixes.
