History of Popes

#132 – Pope Benedict V - Pope from May 22, 964 – June 23, 964. Benedict V was born in Rome and served as a cardinal-deacon before being elected pope. Although the time of Benedict's reign technically fell before that of Leo VIII's, the Church doesn't actually make a distinction of who came first chronologically, considering this was a rather odd period of papal history. John XII was deposed in 963, and Leo VIII was chosen by Otto, the Holy Roman Emperor, to replace him. However, John may never have consented to his removal, which created an awkward situation. After John's death, opponents of Leo picked Benedict V to be next in line since John had deposed Leo prior to his death, which meant Benedict was his legitimate successor. He reigned for one month, until Otto, the Holy Roman Emperor had him forcibly removed and demoted; restoring Leo to the papacy. Benedict was then brought to Germany, where he was under the care of Archbishop Adalagag of Hamburg -- a man who had great respect for Benedict -- until his death on July 4 of the following year. He was initially buried in the cathedral at Hamburg, but his remains were eventually moved to Rome. Given that his pontificate was so short, Benedict wasn't able to become known for much, however, Benedict bore the nickname *Grammaticus* because of his reputation for being intelligent and well-educated.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Last week we saw Jesus traveling to Jerusalem with few belongings and nowhere to lay His head. This week He sends out 72 missionary disciples, two by two, to evangelize, call people to repentance and teach about the Kingdom of God. If the message was rejected they were to move on peacefully. Their mission was highly successful and they rejoiced for even the demons were subject to them because of the name of Jesus. Jesus says, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning." How awesome is that! As stewards of the faith we are called to share the Good News, to witness to the faith and to invite others to come to know Jesus or to be re-introduced to Him. We may be rejected, the message may be rejected, but we pray a seed may have been planted. Demons and evil are all around us and their presence is powerful. Call upon the Holy Spirit for the courage to speak the Truth in the name of Jesus. Think about joining the Step-Up Team who will go out two by two to our brothers and sisters who have fallen away. Let us offer stewardship of time in prayer and worship daily because each day we confront evil and we need to be prepared to do battle in the name of Jesus.

STEWARDSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Kenmore Community Meal - The partnership between I.C. & Park United Methodist has expanded to include a free community meal which will be served in Waldeisen Hall on the last Tuesday of the month from 5 – 6:30 pm. **Ways to help:** help out in the kitchen, be a greeter or a server and help keep costs down by donating requested items in the basket at the front entrance of the church.
