History of Popes

#135 - Pope Benedict VII - Pope from October, 974 - July 10, 983. Benedict was a native Roman and a member of the noble family of the Counts of Tusculum. Benedict was supported by the emperor & the Roman nobility after Franco (known as Antipope Boniface VII) usurped the previous pontiff and was excommunicated & banished. Benedict reigned over a time of political peace in Rome. He was a strong champion of monasticism and the reform of the Church. The movement, started years earlier as an effort to purge monasticism of ambitious clerics & laypeople, continued to grow under St. Mayeul, Abbot of Cluny and began to work its way through the Church. It even reached the pope and the emperor, as both worked to help rid abuses of power at every level. Though little is known about his papacy Benedict made history by naming Archbishop Dietrich of Trier (Germany) to the titular Church of The Four Crowned Martyrs (Santi Quattro Coronati) in 975. The tradition of cardinals being assigned to a church in Rome, which continues to this day, had only applied to native Romans or residents of the city. Dietrich is known as the first non-Roman, non-resident cardinal to be assigned a Roman titular church. What else was going on in the world at the time? In 975, King Edward the Martyr of England is crowned. Edward, regarded as a saint from the time of his death, was not his father's acknowledged heir, but had the support of two of England's archbishops, Sts. Dunstan & Oswald of Worcester, who ultimately made him king. This outraged his brother, Aethelred the Unready and may have been the reason for his murder three years later.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Today's Gospel records Jesus teaching us how to pray & gives us what we know as "The Lord's Prayer". It's probably nearly impossible to estimate the number of times each of us has recited this prayer, so we need to be cautious that it does not become rote – just something we've memorized & recite without thinking about or comprehending its meaning. It is the perfect prayer & as stewards of the faith we need to discern its meaning so that we may teach and share it with full understanding. Our Father gives us everything we need - not necessarily what we want. Take some time this week to reflect on the words Jesus has given us and let them permeate our being. With God's will in mind, ask - for we shall receive, seek - for we shall find; knock and God will open the door for us. May we ask for and seek those things which will bring us closer to God, when we do, God will open the door.
