Advent Reflection

Today's reflection is excerpted from 2020: A Book of Grace-Filled Days by Amy Welborn. How often do we walk into a room and wonder, Wait a minute, what is it I came for? Why am I here? What was I looking for? As Advent begins, we also walk into a room—the room of the rest of our lives that begins anew every day—and we're invited to ask those same questions. And in the very season of Advent itself, we hear the answer. What or whom are we waiting for? The Lord who created us and calls us forward, that's who. Sometimes waiting can be frustrating and seem like a waste of time—until something important comes along. When we know for whom we are waiting—and the promise of glory he holds—that changes everything.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Advent means "coming" or "arrival" so what exactly are we waiting for? Is it presents, decorations, gathering with family, cookies and treats, Santa Claus? For us as Christians, we await the coming of THE BEST GIFT EVER - the Christ Child, the Son of God, the Anointed One, Jesus. We light our homes to symbolize the light Jesus brings to a world darkened by sin and give presents symbolizing the gifts of the Magi, but how are we preparing our hearts for this precious gift? Stewardship of time refers to time spent in prayer, worship, spiritual reading and reflection. This Advent let us strive to put as much effort into our spiritual preparation as we do holiday preparations, send Christmas cards, not holiday cards, call upon the gifts of the Spirit listed in our first reading and do as John the Baptist preached - repent and then prepare the way of the Lord in our hearts and in the hearts and lives of all we meet.
