

•**Adult Faith Enrichment:** Our next socially distant session will be Thurs., Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> and our topic will be centered on how to live out the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist in our lives today.

•**The Kenmore Free Store** will be open as long as the county is at level 2 or lower. You **must wear a mask**. We are allowing five shoppers in at a time in 20 minute intervals. Because of this, 30 minutes have been added to shopping hours: Tuesday, 4 – 7 pm and Saturday, 9 am – noon. **Donations:** The bin will remain closed, but donations will be accepted in front of the school on 16<sup>th</sup> St. SW **during store hours**.

•**Drive-Thru Blessing Event** for those not yet coming to Mass: Sun., Oct. 24<sup>th</sup> from 12:30 – 1:30 pm. Stay in your car, wear a mask, drop off your envelopes, get a bulletin and see Fr. Mike (maybe Fr. Sam) and receive a blessing. This is for those not yet coming to Mass – those coming to Mass receive a blessing at Mass.

•**Priesthood Sunday** – On Sun., Oct. 25<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate the gift of priesthood. Reflect on this gift and consider sending a personal note or a card of thanks to priests who have been instrumental in your faith formation.

## History of Popes

**#182 –Pope Urban IV** - Pope from Aug. 29, 1261 – death, Oct. 2, 1264. The son of a French cobbler, Jacques Pantaléon was known for being vigorously active, well-educated, yet still pious and holy. He was serving as the Archdeacon of Liège (Belgium) when he was noticed by Pope Innocent IV at the Council of Lyons in 1245. From there, he was sent as papal legate to Poland, Prussia, and Germany, all in a period of six years. He was briefly assigned as Bishop of Verdun, & then served as the Patriarch of Jerusalem from 1255 until his election. In 1261, he was visiting Rome on official business when the 7 remaining cardinal electors realized that his great skill in diplomacy and statesmanship, as well as his healthy dislike for the Hohenstaufen (the imperial family in Germany), would make him a solid pope. He was quickly elected and consecrated, likely choosing the name “Urban” after Urban II, a fellow Frenchman. He spent most of his papacy in Orvieto. Urban was best known for quickly and effectively undoing much of the damage against both papal authority in Rome and Church property throughout Italy. He started by balancing the papal finances and paying Alexander’s debts. Urban then frustrated the Ghibellines, the anti-papal faction in Rome, with his knowledge of the law, while building up the Guelphs, the pro-pope faction. He helped appoint Charles I as King of Sicily and eventually senator in Rome. The pope remained close with King St. Louis IX of France, held two consistories (basically cardinal-naming events) and increased the number of cardinals from 7 to 21 to further protect papal elections from abuse. Pope Urban instituted the Feast of Corpus Christi celebrating the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. In 1264, Urban published a papal bull, **Transiturus**, stating “We should celebrate continuously the memory of this memorial, because the more frequently his gift & favor are looked upon, so much the more firmly are they kept in memory. Therefore, although this memorial Sacrament is frequented in the daily solemnities of the Mass, we nevertheless think suitable and worthy that, at least once a year – especially to confound the lack of faith and the infamy of heretics – a more solemn and honorable memory of this Sacrament be held.” Near the time of his death, Urban was travelling to Assisi when he fell ill. He was taken to Perugia where he died. What else was going on in the world at the time? In June of 1264, the first known meeting of the Irish legislature was held at Castledermot in County Kildare.

### STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

In our Gospel, we read of a wedding feast given by the king for his son. Invitations went out & were ignored and some of the king’s servants were killed. This is an invitation by God to the Messianic banquet & the invitations were announced by the prophets, many of whom were murdered. Battles ensued, wars were fought and then the invitation went out to those other than the Chosen People. The invitation was freely given to all & the banquet was ready, but still people did not prepare themselves properly and were turned away, “Many are invited, but few are chosen.” We are now the invited, the banquet is ready, but are we? Are we using our gifts & talents to the fullest? Are we sharing our stewardship joyfully? Are we morally centered in God’s Truth? Do we participate in charitable opportunities by more than writing a check? Are we repentant of our sins? Do we care for those in need? Have we replaced God with something or someone else? Have we become so complacent and smug that we don’t need God? Are we people of prayer whose lives are lived according to Gospel values? “Many are invited, but few are chosen.”
