History of Popes

#216 – Julius II - Pope from Nov. 1, 1503 – death, Feb. 21, 1513. Giuliano della Rovere, the nephew of Pope Sixtus IV, was born Dec. 5, 1443. He entered the Franciscans at a young age and was made a cardinal within months of his uncle's election in 1471. He was assigned as bishop of 12 different dioceses over the years in addition to being in charge of several abbeys. Giuliano, as was the case with several other recent popes, also fathered three daughters prior to his election. Considered for the papacy twice before, he was beaten by Alexander VI and Pius III, respectively, in the two previous elections. In 1503, he was elected essentially by making a deal with Cesare Borgia, son of Alexander and influential political player in the Papal States. As pope, Julius displayed his political power early, using his armies to first defeat Cesare, then to try and save some semblance of papal authority in Italy in the wake of France and Spain warring over Naples. Unfortunately, the political situation and Julius' own lack of emphasis on moral reform prevented the Church from advancing much in those arenas. It was during his pontificate that much of the Church's artistic patrimony from those times was solidified. Despite a stormy attitude toward the Renaissance artists themselves, his commissions included Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel ceiling and the four magnificent "Raphael Rooms" in the Vatican Palace. Julius was also responsible for starting construction on a new St. Peter's Basilica, the very same massive structure we're able to enjoy today. The highly-trained and brightly-colored Swiss Guard have protected pontiffs for over 500 years, due to an alliance Julius II made with the nation while serving as pope. What else was going on in the world at the time? On September 8, 1504, Michelangelo's sculpture of *David* was put on display in Florence for the first time.
