History of Popes

#238 –**Pope Clement IX** - Pope from June 20, 1667 – death, Dec. 9, 1669. Giulio Rospigliosi was born in January 28, 1600 to a noble Tuscan family. He was educated at the Roman Seminary and the University of Pisa, where he earned several doctorates and remained as a professor of philosophy for two years. Giulio was virtuous and a naturally-gifted diplomat. His love of literature, music, and poetry was shared by Pope Urban VIII, who appointed Giulio Nuncio to Spain for 11 years. He then sat out the papacy of Innocent X but was appointed Cardinal Secretary of State once Alexander VII was elected. Giulio was the perfect candidate following Alexander VII's death. The Romans liked his charitable demeanor, the Spanish liked him for having been their nuncio for a decade, and the French were indifferent. Taking the name Clement IX upon election, he balanced the papal finances for the first time in years, forged an unusual peace – known as the *Pax Clementina* – with the Jansenists, and corrected various abuses in the New World. It's fair to say that Clement IX was best known as embodying the humble title of "Servant of the Servants of God." Clement was known to spend two days of every week hearing confessions in St. Peter's Basilica, he gave generously to Rome's poor, and he made frequent personal visits to the hospitalized. He shirked all notoriety, forbidding his name to be placed on any new building and adamantly refused to engage in nepotism. Among his other canonizations and beatifications, Clement beatified the first saint of the Americas, St. Rose of Lima, on April 15, 1668

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Jesus teaches on the meaning of neighbor in today's Gospel. To inherit eternal life, one must love God and love neighbor. The law scholar asks Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" In answering, Jesus describes the essence of the Christian mission with the parable of the Good Samaritan. The scholar was trying to trick Jesus into explaining who belongs to God's people and who doesn't – remember Jews & Samaritans were enemies. Jesus, by making the Samaritan the hero, the one who shows mercy, turns the entire situation around. The question is no longer centered on who belongs to God's people, but on what is required of God's people – to love the Lord with all your heart, being, strength and mind and your neighbor as yourself. Jesus teaches that neighbors are everywhere; there is NO ONE WHO IS NOT OUR NEIGHBOR whether they are next door or half-way around the world. Who are the Samaritans in your life who need to become neighbors? Which preconceptions & stereotypes do you need to change?
