STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

This week our scriptures center on forgiveness. Sirach asks a couple of tough questions: "Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the Lord? Could anyone refuse mercy to another like himself, can he seek pardon for his own sins?" Peter asks Jesus how many times he needs to forgive someone and Jesus responds with seventy-seven times; in other words, every time. Forgiveness is something we seek from others, but which we may be slow in giving. St. Paul reminds us that we don't live for ourselves but for the Lord – it's not about us – never was, never will be. As stewards of the faith, we're called to live by and witness to Gospel values which include mercy and forgiveness. When praying about and reflecting on your level of forgiveness and mercy, keep in mind the last lines from Sirach: "Remember your last days, set enmity (hostility) aside; remember death and decay, and cease from sin! Think of the commandments, hate not your neighbor, remember the Most High's covenant and overlook faults."

A parish family is like a personal family. There are jobs & chores that need doing & if they don't get done, things don't run smoothly. Here are "chores/jobs" that need doing.

Liturgical Ministries: We only have 6 active servers and one is out due to surgery so we can't even cover all the Masses; we need men, women and students to step forward to assist Fr. Mike at the altar. We're also seeking students and adults who have a heart for Sacred Scripture to proclaim the readings as **Lectors**. Training will be provided for both ministries. 
