#### STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

#### Being Stewards of the Faith

As we continue to delve into the theology of the Eucharist, we need to remember that it was Jesus himself who gave us this wonderful gift. One of the major documents which came out of Vatican II was Sacrosanctum concilium, or the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, which dealt with all things liturgical. It states. "At the Last Supper, on the night he was betrayed, our Savior instituted the eucharistic sacrifice of His Body and Blood. This He did in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until He should come again, and so to entrust to His beloved Spouse, the Church, a memorial of His death and resurrection: A sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a Paschal banquet in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us." (paragraph 47 and quoted in the Catechism #1323) When we receive the Eucharist, it is Jesus Himself we're receiving. This gift and this opportunity for grace entrusted to us to remember the sacrifice of our Lord on the cross should have us so excited that we can't wait for the next opportunity.

#### STEWARDSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

A parish family is like a personal family. There are jobs & chores that need doing & if they don't get done, things don't run smoothly. Here are "chores/jobs" that need doing.

**Liturgical Ministries**: We only have 6 active servers so we can't even cover all the Masses. We need men, women and students to step forward to assist at the altar. We're also seeking students & adults to proclaim the readings as **Lectors**. Training will be provided for both ministries. Please call the rectory to share your stewardship.

**Free Store Help** – Have a heart for those in need & like to work with friendly, faith-filled people? Stop by Tuesdays, 4-7 pm or Saturdays, 9 am -12 pm, to check it out & join the team!

**Funeral Dinner Ministry** can use help. Be part of the team who puts on the meal and ministers to the family or sign up to be called when food is needed. Call the rectory.

**CareCards** – Let our shut-ins know they are not forgotten & are important to us. Buy or create cards of encouragement, add a short note & sign your name. Put the cards into the envelope (do not seal) & place into the basket. Your cards are distributed during First Friday Communion Calls. Please, no cards from charitable or religious organizations.

**Bingo:** We are in real need of Bingo help. Do you have even one Wednesday a month to call Bingo, sell Instant Bingo or learn the office from our amazing Bingo Manager, Lorie? We need more people to serve our clientele & rotate workers. Bingo income is **critical** to our parish finances so come help, be part of a team, meet new people & help your parish.

**Acme Cashback**: The current campaign began August 1<sup>st</sup>. Purchase Acme Brand, Top Care, etc., save your Acme receipts and place them in the baskets at the doors to help raise funds for the parish.
