<u>STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS</u> - Being Stewards of the Faith - The Eucharist

Jesus instituted the gift of the Eucharist at the Last Supper as a memorial of His death and resurrection and commanded His apostles to celebrate it until he returned; that command has been handed down through the ages to us today and it is our responsibility to hand it down to future generations. We are asked not only to remember Jesus and His sacrifice on our behalf when we come to Mass, but to memorialize Him, His life, death, Resurrection and intercession in the presence of the Father for all of us. (Catechism #1341) To memorialize means to do more than just remember, but to keep what Jesus did for us alive in our memories, to honor and keep it uppermost in our thoughts. God chose to enter our sinful world by sending His Son, who through complete obedience to His Father's will and for the sake of each and every one of us, willingly suffered and ultimately gave up His life so we might have everlasting life. How can we stay away? How can we not come to Mass and honor that? How can we refuse to accept this most precious gift of Jesus Himself?
