STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS - Being Stewards of the Eucharist

As Catholics, when we come to Communion to receive the Eucharist, we're receiving, from Christ, His body which He gave up for us on the cross and the blood He shed for us. The sacrificial nature of the Eucharist is contained in the words Jesus spoke at the Last Supper, "Then He took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them saying, 'This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' And then, "And He did the same with the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my Blood." (Lk. 22:19-20) Matthew records the moment with these words, "While they were eating, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it He broke it, gave it to the disciples, and said 'Take, eat; this is my body.' Then He took a cup, and after giving thanks He gave it to them saying 'Drink from it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins'" (Mt. 26:26-28) Jesus did not say, this is LIKE my body or this is LIKE my blood. The Catechism tells us that "the Eucharist is thus a sacrifice because it *re-presents* (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross..." (1366) *There is a* definite fundamental and theological difference between Who is received at Communion in the Catholic Church and what is received at Communion in non-Catholic faith traditions. Please do not be led to believe anything else. The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice as the victim is one and the same.
