STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the people of Galilee, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." These are the same words said to us on Ash Wednesday as we receive the mark of Christ on our foreheads. The beginning of the Lenten season is still a few weeks away, but this is a good time to begin to reflect on the things for which we need to repent and to reflect on just how much we believe in and follow the words and teachings of Jesus in the Gospel accounts left to us by the Evangelists. As Jesus walked past the Sea of Galilee, He spotted Simon and Andrew and to these simple fishermen said, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." A bit further along He saw James and John and called out to them as well. The four didn't even know Jesus, but dropped everything, left all they had and followed Him. We were called at Baptism. Do we follow Jesus with the same unquestioning faith as the Apostles? If not, why not? When Jesus calls us to use our talents in a particular ministry or for the good of our parish or the Church, do we joyfully answer or ignore Him? These are the kinds of questions to reflect on as Lent approaches.
