### Lenten reflection: From Henri J.M. Nouwen in God's Abiding Love

"You are a child of God. I want you for a moment, for a few minutes, to think about it not intellectually but go with me and listen to me simply saying the same thing in different ways. See if you can make connections here. Because God is saying to us you are my child. You are written in the palms of my hands. You are hidden in the shadow of my hands. I have molded you out of the secret of the earth. I have knitted you together in your mother's womb. You belong to me. I am yours, you are mine. I have called you from eternity. You are the one who is held safe and embraced in love from eternity to eternity. You belong to me. I am holding you safe and I want you to know that whatever happens to you I am always there. I was always there. I always will be there and hold you in my embrace. You are mine. You are my child."

#### STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

At baptism, water was poured over us and the Holy Spirit was invoked on our behalf. In our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, St. Peter reminds us that that water wasn't just to wash away dirt from our bodies, it was meant to wash away original sin, cleanse our souls for God and clear our consciences. A lot has happened since most of us were baptized! We've just entered the 40 days of Lent -- why 40 days? In the Gospel, the Holy Spirit leads Jesus into the desert for 40 days to pray, fast and face Satan, the Great Deceiver. This Lent, where is the Spirit leading you? What's on your conscience that needs to be cleared? What's in your heart that's not of God that's keeping you from being who God created you to be? How are you living out the 3 pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving? Has the Great Deceiver put something more important in your path that keeps you too busy to pray, read scripture, go to Stations, even go to Mass? Did you pick up a Lenten reflection book? What about fasting? Do you need to fast from power, prestige, material things, anxiety? How about almsgiving? Did you make a pledge to Catholic Charities? Did you pick up a Rice Bowl? Do you support our food pantry or our Free Store? Conversion doesn't happen overnight. It takes time to get our priorities right and it's not always pretty. Conversion takes time, a willingness to look deep within, find those places the Great Deceiver has been busy and turn them over to the Lord and then to surrender to His will with an open heart.
