We have a variation of that in our second reading from St. John who tells us, "Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." At some point in our lives, we've probably experienced someone promising something to us and doing the opposite; we may even have done that to others ourselves. It might have been a little white lie (although no lies are really little) or something unexpected might have come up that kept us from our promise - either way it could have a negative effect on our integrity and reliability. As Children of God, we must strive to be consistent; to make sure that what we say and what we do harmonize and correspond to Gospel values because that is our call and others who may not be churchgoers watch us. It's one thing to say we love others, but if our actions, our deeds, prove otherwise, we are talking out of both sides of our mouths, we are loving in word or speech, but not in deed and truth.
