STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Today we honor the Mystery of Faith known as the Holy Trinity – one God in 3 distinct Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is the relationship shared within this Godhead that teaches us how we are to live in community and in love. Each time we make the Sign of the Cross, we profess our belief in what the Catechism tells us is “the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself.” (234) Remember a Mystery of Faith is not something that is mysterious, but something that is hidden in God and can be revealed by God alone. Throughout Sacred Scripture God gives us hints of his Trinitarian work and identity and we have examples of that in our readings this weekend. Let us take time this week to ponder this mystery of the God who rescued us, made covenants with us, adopted us as His children and heirs of eternal life and gave us the gift of faith that we might believe.

Low gluten hosts: If you have difficulty digesting gluten and it makes you ill, please contact the rectory.

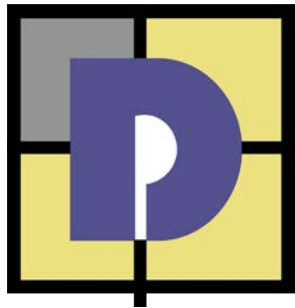
St. Augustine School Enrollment: Packets and Ed Choice Scholarship request forms may be found on the bottom shelf of the book rack at the back of the church.

Diocesan 50th Wedding Anniversary Mass: Each year the diocese celebrates the Catholic marriages of couples married 50 years.
