It was decided to move the 5:30 pm Vigil Mass to 5:00 pm which would be Traditional in worship style. These changes will take place the first weekend in July.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Fr. Mike often reminds us that the first time we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist is important, but it's the next time and the next time and the next time, etc. that are the most important. Sadly, many have forgotten that and have abandoned this central teaching of the faith which is why the Church is in the midst of a Eucharistic Revival. Re-read the Gospel (Mk. 14:22-26) and reflect on the words of our Savior. After taking the bread, He blessed and broke it saying “Take it; this is my body.” After taking the cup He said “This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many...” He DID NOT SAY - this is like my body and blood or this symbolizes my body and blood or this represents my body and blood. He said this **IS** my body; this **IS** my blood and as Catholics, we believe that Jesus meant exactly what He said. During COVID, we watched Mass on TV as we were all shut-ins, but we need to return to church, return to the community and return to the Eucharist which is the spiritual food we need to make it through this life.

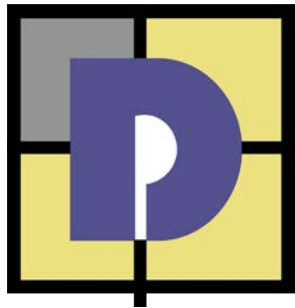
