Again, this is *not* unique to our parish. We're working very hard to ensure we have priests for our weekend Masses.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

I'd like to update you on some important information. At the Town Hall Meeting we discussed roofing and stonework needs. We've been seeking bids, but are having difficulty getting bids back in a timely manner; we're going to address this again in the spring. In the meantime, we need to be raising some serious funds and we're working on that; any ideas would be most welcome. The roof may cost \$65,000-\$74,000 and the stone work on the rectory peaks and the church \$63,000-\$77,000. That doesn't count the steps in front of the rectory which are not a priority at this time. The parking lot looks wonderful and should last us many years. The cost for sealing and striping was \$3,950.00 which was taken from our Capital Improvement account. Also, from that account we paid bills for plumbing problems in Hitch Hall and work on the digital system that runs the boiler for the church. Remember having no heat around Holy Week? The use of your Capital Improvement envelopes is important as we never know what's coming around the corner. If you'd like that donation to go towards our roofing fund, please write ROOF on that envelope. Lastly, for years we've been trying to pay down a loan from the diocese for health benefits for teachers in the school. Happily, that is paid off and no longer weighing on us.
