Mary, Mother of God Holy Day: On this Holy Day we recognize that "Mary is truly the 'Mother of God' since she is the mother of the eternal Son of God made man, which is God Himself." (Catechism # 509) In Greek she is the *Theotokos*, meaning "God bearing" and in Latin *Deipara*, from *Deus*, God, and *parire* meaning "to bring forth, to bear." The title was conferred on Mary at the Council of Ephesus in AD 431 and is the oldest of Mary's feasts. The **Vigil Mass** on December 31<sup>st</sup> will be celebrated at **5:30 pm**. Mass on the Holy Day, January 1<sup>st</sup> will be celebrated at **10:00 am**.

**Exposition & Adoration** will be held in the church from 1-2 pm on January 3<sup>rd</sup> – the First Friday of January. All are welcome to come and be with Jesus in the Eucharist. Just sit with Jesus, tell him your joys and sorrows, difficulties and anxieties and allow Him to do what He does best – restore, heal and transform.

Adult Faith Enrichment does not meet in January nor February because of the uncertainty of the weather. Our next session will be Thursday, March 6<sup>th</sup>. "Christian marriage is the union of a man and a woman bound by the same transforming fidelity which Christ has for His Church: for better or worse. When a people lose confidence in fidelity between husbands and wives, it is an easy leap to imagine that other fidelities-of parents to children, and of adult children to their elder parents-no longer need to be permanent, for-better-or-for-worse obligations. When a family lives in fidelity it is a place of refuge and dignity, a place where each member is accepted, respected and honored precisely because he or she is a person; and if any member is in greater need, the care which he or she receives is all the more intense and attentive."

### **STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS**

Is your family holy? Did you come from a holy family? Does holy mean perfect? Was the Holy Family perfect? Well, if we read the Gospel, we'll find out the answer is no. After leaving Jerusalem following Passover, Joseph and Mary traveled for an entire day before realizing Jesus was not with them then it took them 3 days to find Him. Once found, Mary said to Jesus, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." That's probably a bit of an understatement! Granted there was a much more nuclear family dynamic back then, but wow. Jesus, of course, did not consider himself lost at all, but right where His Father wanted Him. None of us came from perfect families, that's a given, but were they holy? To be holy means to be set apart for a particular purpose. As Christians, that purpose is to live in, with and for God. If this doesn't describe the family who reared you, have you reared your family this way? What changes could be made? To be holy doesn't mean walking around with a halo over your head. It simply means that you dedicate your life to God and try every day to live out your Baptismal call to the fullest. Will you make mistakes - of course, but just remember the story of the Holy Family (and this is just one story). Pick yourself up, acknowledge the mistake, take ownership of it and move forward. Perfection is impossible; holiness is not.
