### STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world (Catechism # 528). Those in Israel knew of the birth and of the prophecies of the coming Messiah, but those outside of Israel would not have known. The arrival of and homage by the Magi who were representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, to Jesus, king of the Jews, brought the birth of the Christ to the entire world. The magi sought, in Israel, the messianic light of the star of David, the one who would be king of the nations (CCC #528). This event is the manifestation or revelation of Jesus as the Son of God, Savior and King of the world - the entire world. The homage given by the Magi shows that pagans, not just Jews, could worship Jesus. To us today, this Solemnity gives light to the fact that Jesus came for everyone of every nation. How do we show our gratitude? What gifts do we offer to our King?
