Our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading is part of a series of responses to questions and reservations Jewish Christians living in Jerusalem were having regarding Jesus. They were tempted to abandon their new faith and return to their Hebrew faith. The writer of Hebrews, who is unknown, is trying to reassure them that Jesus is indeed the Messiah and Savior who came as one of us, flesh and blood, that through His death He would destroy the one who has power over death, the Devil, the Great Deceiver. Do you know someone who has been deceived by the Devil someone who is living in sin, fear and guilt who thinks they can never be forgiven by God? That thinking is strictly from the Devil for God loves all He created and is calling them to Himself. As stewards of faith, it's important that we share this truth with those who are lost and encourage them to seek the Lord. Share your stories, invite them to Mass or a parish event and walk with them on their journey back to God.
