Holy Family Candle - Special Intention

Lent: Stations of the Cross will be prayed on the Fridays of Lent at 5:30 pm. Rice Bowls to support Catholic Relief Services, Bishop Robert Barron's Lenten Gospel Reflection Books and the helpful Journey Through Lent flier may be found at all doors of the church.

Fast & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are obligatory days of fast & abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all between 18 and 59 years old. Fasting allows a person one full meal & two smaller meals, not to equal one full meal; no snacking between meals. Abstinence from meat and meat products is obligatory beginning at 14. Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of complete abstinence.

IRA Information: As Christian stewards, we share the responsibility of making our Church a community of faith and a vibrant source of service to the larger community. That includes not only providing financial support for now, but also building a firm financial foundation for the future. Did you know that your IRA can be a tool to help you do this? If you're 70-1/2 years old or older, you can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution for up to \$1,000,000 from your IRA directly to our parish. The Holy Spirit will never lead us into temptation nor steer us away from the will of God; It will sustain us especially in times of food, but was symbolic of His desire to be filled with the Spirit as well as His acknowledgment of His dependence on the Spirit. This Lent, let's acknowledge our helplessness, humble ourselves before God and call upon the Spirit to sustain and strengthen us.
