Lent: The 3 Pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting & almsgiving. Please join us on the Fridays of Lent to **pray** the **Stations of the Cross** at 5:30 pm. At the doors of the church, you'll find **Rice Bowls** to support Catholic Relief Services. Please put in spare change, **fast** and put the savings in your bowl, put in the amount saved by what you've given up during Lent. Your **Lenten alms** will serve to help those who literally have nothing. At the doors, you'll find copies of Bishop Barron's **Lenten Gospel Reflection Books** as well as our helpful **Journey Through Lent** handout.

Fast & Abstinence: Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of complete abstinence from meat and meat products beginning at age 14. Fasting is obligatory for all between the ages of 18 and 59. Fasting allows a person one full meal & two smaller meals, not to equal one full meal; no snacking between meals. Good Friday is a day of obligatory fast.

IRA Information: As stewards, we share responsibility for making our parish a community of faith and vibrant source of service to the larger community by providing financial support for now & building a firm financial foundation for the future. If you're 70-1/2 years old or older, your IRA can be a tool to help you do this by making a Qualified Charitable Distribution for up to \$1,000,000 directly to our parish. Journey with the Pope

"The Gospel says: He "led them up a high mountain" (v.2). In the Bible, the mountain always has a special significance: it is the elevated place where heaven and earth touch each other, where Moses and the prophets had the extraordinary experience of encountering God. Climbing the mountain is drawing somewhat close to God. Jesus climbs up with the three disciples and they stop at the top of the mountain. Here, He is transfigured before them. His face radiant and His garments glistening, which provide a preview of the image as the Risen One, offer to those frightened men the light, the light of hope, the light to pass through the shadows: death will not be the end of everything, because it will open to the glory of the Resurrection."

This week we read of the Transfiguration of the Lord Jesus. Jesus went up the mountain to pray and took Peter, John and James with Him. In a scene reminiscent of the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus prayed and His disciples slept. While in prayer, Jesus underwent a radical transformation which allowed the radiance of His glory to be seen. At this point the disciples woke up and saw Him conversing with Moses and Elijah about the exodus He would bring about in Jerusalem through His death and resurrection, something Jesus had just begun to explain to the 12. Then they became enveloped in a cloud and heard the voice of God say, "This is my chosen Son; listen to Him." God is with us every moment of every day. Do we recognize His presence or are we sleep-walking our way through life? Are we listening to Him faithfully or only when we want to? Are we willing to carry our own crosses, trust in the Lord and accompany Him to the presence of God? As we enter deeper into the Lenten season, let's reflect on those questions, be honest with our answers and resolve to be more faithful and faith filled every day.
