Lent: The 3 Pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting & almsgiving. Join us on Fridays as we *pray* the *Stations of the Cross* at 5:30 pm. Come and *pray* during *Exposition and Adoration* from 1-2 pm on Friday, April 4th. Fast and put the savings in your *Rice Bowls* to support Catholic Relief Services. Fast & Abstinence: Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of complete abstinence from meat and meat products beginning at age 14. <u>Fasting</u> is obligatory for all between the ages of 18 and 59. Fasting allows a person one full meal & two smaller meals, not to equal one full meal; no snacking between meals. <u>Good Friday</u> is a day of obligatory fast.
