
Holy Family Candle - Special Intention

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

He is Risen, Alleluia! On this, the greatest and oldest Christian feast, we joyfully celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus the Christ, from the dead. As miraculous as they were, there is a big difference between the Resurrection of Jesus and those brought back to ordinary, earthly life by Jesus. Unlike Jairus' daughter, the man of Naim and Lazarus who would all eventually experience death, Jesus' Resurrection was NOT a return to earthly life. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us, "In his risen body he passes from the state of death to another life beyond time and space. At Jesus' Resurrection his body is filled with the power of the Holy Spirit: he shares the divine life in His glorious state..." (#646) Today we stand in awe at this mystery of faith which the Catechism defines as "a transcendent intervention of God himself in creation and history" (648) and we rejoice that by His Passion, Death and Resurrection, Jesus frees us from the awful weight of sin and opens for us the way to a new life with Him for all eternity in heaven. He is risen, Alleluia!
