Gospel Reflections from Bishop Robert Barron

"Jesus declares, 'I am the living bread that came down from heaven.' The bread is referred to as living. Bread is good, but it's not alive. Instead, when we take it in and it is turned by our bodies into fat or muscle or bone, then it comes alive. But it is just the opposite with the living bread of Christ. This we take in and we become alive in a way that we were not before. And this is why Jesus says that He is bread come down from heaven...Whatever heaven is, it is the realm of God and therefore it is a realm of love. What is the Eucharist, this heavenly food, but a participation in the love between the Father and the Son? In the Eucharist, the sacrifice of Christ is made present and the sacrifice of Christ is the fullest expression of the love of the Father and the Son."

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Jesus tells His disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word and my Father will love him and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." What wonderful news! Love the Son, keep His word/live by His word, and we'll be loved by the Father and Father and Son will dwell in us. It doesn't get much better than that; there's just one thing - we're not perfect and don't live in a perfect world so how do we accomplish this daily? Jesus knows we're sinners; He knew His disciples were sinners and would need help so He talks about the Holy Spirit, the Advocate. What is an advocate? According to the dictionary it's someone who pleads on behalf of another; an intercessor, supporter and defender. The Holy Spirit will accompany us on our journeys of faith, helping us live out our baptismal promises and interceding to the Father through Jesus on our behalf. Let's reflect on this great gift in our stewardship time of prayer.
