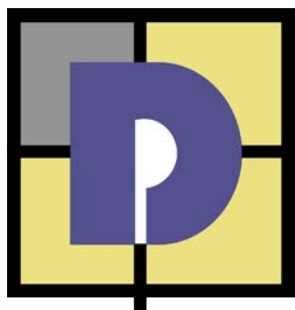
Offsite Events
