In Exodus, Moses needed the help of Aaron and Hur to hold his hands up so that Israel could claim victory over their enemy. Do you have friends you can turn to when you tire? It's clear in the psalm that our help comes from the Lord who guards our comings and goings now and in the future. How strong is your prayer life; how often do you go to the Lord in prayer? Timothy reminds us that we have the gift of Sacred Scripture to give us “wisdom for salvation through faith in Jesus.” Jesus tells us to be persistent and faithful in our prayer. Are you? God has given us so many gifts to help us through this journey of life. Go to God in prayer, read and pray with the scriptures, call on friends and ask for their prayers. The last line of the Gospel is chilling, “But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth? Let's be people of great faith and share that faith with others to help them along the way.

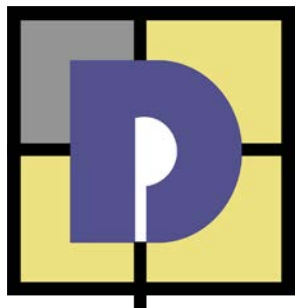
The Acme Cashback program runs thru February 15, 2026 so save those Acme receipts. Please see the flyers at the main door and main side door for brand name information.
