STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Have you ever thought you had total control over your life; that every material thing you own and the money you have in the bank is all your own doing? If so, what need have you for God? That misguided attitude, the need for humility and God's attentiveness to the poor is what's addressed in our scriptures this week. Sirach tells us that the Lord is a God of justice, who hears the cries of the poor, the oppressed, the orphan, the widow and those who serve God willingly. The psalm echoes what Sirach says about God who confronts evildoers and is close to the brokenhearted. Jesus tells of the Pharisee whose ego is off the charts and of the tax collector who recognizes his sinfulness and pleads for God's mercy. It's when we think like the Pharisee – that all we have and do is because of our own skills and abilities that we're in need of God's mercy and forgiveness because we've failed to be poor in spirit. Everything we have, do and are is a gift from God and we need to humbly acknowledge that before our Lord. We want to be right with God in all we do so that at the end of our lives we can say, like St. Paul, "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith."
