Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F, 12:05 pm & Tuesdays, 5:15 pm. **St. Francis:** Confessions – Saturdays, 9-9:45 am & Thursdays from 5:30-6:15 pm. Daily Mass: M-F, 8:15 am & Thursdays at 6:30 pm.

Church Decorating: Come and help make our church beautiful for Christmas this Monday, December 22nd beginning at 6:30 pm.

Christmas Masses will be celebrated on **Christmas Eve at 5 pm** and **Christmas morning at 10 am**. Pre-Mass music will begin at 9:45 am.

Holiday hours: The rectory will be closed from 11:45 am until 2 pm this Monday, December 22nd for a staff event. It will close at noon on Christmas Eve and will be closed on Christmas Day and Friday, December 26th. There will be NO Bingo on Christmas Eve, December 24th, but Bingo will be played on December 31st. The Food Pantry will be closed on Christmas and New Year's Day.

Holy Day January 1st is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated on Wednesday, December 31st at 5 pm and Thursday, January 1st at 10 am.

Exposition and Adoration will be held in the church on Friday, January 2nd from 1-2 pm. Come and spend some time with Jesus. All are welcome

Snow Entry: If we get a heavy snow during the weekends, entry to the church and to Mass will be through Hitch Hall only. We do not have the personnel to remove snow effectively.

Jesus, My Home from *Living in Hope* Advent Meditations from the writings of Henri Nouwen.

The place of our true belonging is not a place made by human hands. It is fashioned for us by God, who came to pitch his tent among us, invite us to his place, and prepare a room for us in his own house. Words for "home" are often used in the Old and New Testaments. The Psalms are filled with yearning to dwell in the house of God...It is highly significant that St. John describes Jesus as the Word of God living among us (Jn 1:14), and in his farewell address, Jesus reveals himself as the new home: "Abide in me as I abide in you" (15:4). By making his home in us Jesus allows us to make our home in him. By entering into the intimacy of our innermost self he offers us the opportunity to enter into his own intimacy with God. By choosing us as *his* preferred dwelling place he invites us to choose him as *our* preferred dwelling place. This is the mystery of the Incarnation.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

It's almost time!! The Christ Child is almost here!! We have waited and prepared our hearts and homes for His arrival. Can you imagine what Mary and Joseph have been experiencing for the past 9 months? Their journey to this moment has been incredible to say the least. They find out they're going to be parents to the son of God by the power of the Holy Spirit - incredible doesn't even come close to describing this mystery of our faith. Think back to your younger days and the joy and anticipation you felt as Christmas approached. Did Santa get your letter? Would the presents you hoped for be under the tree? What was your favorite present? We all enjoy receiving presents and know that it's social convention (as Sheldon from The Big Bang Theory would say) to exchange them at certain times of the year like birthdays and special occasions, but when someone gives us an unexpected gift, not an expected present and one that just takes our breath away, it is an act of love. That's what Christmas is all about. On Christmas we receive the greatest GIFT of love ever given, that of Jesus, Son of God, our Savior and Redeemer. Let's receive this gift of love and the peace, hope and light He offers with joy, gratitude, humility and open hearts.


