### **STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS**

As I write this, I’m thinking back to the days when the church was full on the weekends with one Mass on Saturdays and 3 on Sundays. Over the 43 years, I’ve been a parishioner and staff member here, I remember the festivals, fundraisers, the tent assemblies, an active school, chili cook-offs, soup for the soul meals, dances, international dinners, ice cream socials, pizza and pumpkin decorating fun, large choirs, picnics, bus trips, Bingo and so much more. I remember faith formation opportunities, beautiful Christmas Masses, sacred Holy Week services, Stations of the Cross with Benediction, Eucharistic processions, joyous Easter celebrations – Fr. Mike loved drowning us! Over the 102 years we’ve been in existence, we’ve had wonderful priests and religious who served, taught, laughed and cried with us. So many students were educated and received Sacraments here. So many were married and so many were buried.

With all the wonderful memories also come the not so good memories and difficult times. Through the years, the good times have been able to surpass the bad times, but that’s not the case now; difficulties have overwhelmed the good times. Bishop Pilla used to say that people vote with their feet and that has happened to us. People have left for reasons known only to them. It’s a different world than it was in the days when sacrifice and loyalty meant something and people worked so hard to build and give us this beautiful parish. Also, the practice of the faith across the board and across denominations has also taken a hit and people just aren’t going to church like they used to.

We have a wonderful core of stewards here at Immaculate Conception who’ve stepped forward to try to keep things going, but unfortunately, there are just not enough of us left. The parish has been facing financial difficulty for over 40 years and it’s by the grace of God that we’ve made it to this moment in time. As we all know, the price of everything has gone up and that includes the things that affect the parish most, such as the cost of utilities, insurance, taxes and more and while those numbers go up, the number of worshipers has gone down. When you combine that with the roof, stonework and other repairs needed, what we are facing, financially, is insurmountable.

With Catholic Charities taking the school building and Waldeisen Hall, the legacy of service to those in need that we have built here will continue and will grow.

The Free Store and Food Pantry welcome anyone who would like to help and that offers opportunities for parishioners to continue to work together even though their places of worship may differ.

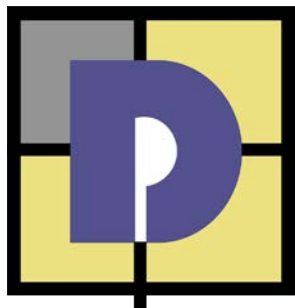

- Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Cleveland will be purchasing both the school building and Waldeisen Hall. It is their intention to continue the outreach ministries we already have at I.C. (the Free Store, Food Pantry, Community Garden, Community Meal) and to offer even more services by creating a Family Center.
- Staff will be on the property in January; how long has not yet been determined, but Melissa will be on site through January 31<sup>st</sup>.
